EDUCATION PRESENTATION

The Chair, S. Fraser, introduced Shelby Poletti who provided an education session on Accreditation which will be taking place from April 25-29, 2022. A slideshow was provided which outlined an Overview, What is Accreditation, How the Accreditation Process Works, Focus of Standards, Focus on People-Centred Care, System Wide Standards, Service Excellence Standards, Required Organizational Practices, Instruments Completed, Priority Process Review, Level of Accreditation (Outcome of Survey), SJCG Accreditation History, Onsite Survey Process, On Site Survey, Survey Week – Key Activities, Preparing for the Survey, Factors Affecting Survey Readiness, Board Awareness on Evidence of Client-Centred Care, Self-Assessments, Governance Preparedness, Summary of Findings from the 2019 Environmental Scan, Priority Process for Governance, Governance Functioning Tool/Completion and Access, and a Timeline of What's Next. A link will be sent out to Board Members following today's meeting for completion of the Governance Functioning Tool no later than November 30, 2021. A Simulated Tracer education activity will also take place at the March Board Meeting, and a Governance Tracer Survey will be completed by the Board during the week of Accreditation.

S. Poletti responded to questions from Committee confirming the peer surveyors are health care professionals and administrators from accredited health care organizations who are trained by Accreditation Canada. The Board was also assured that St. Joseph's Care Group is survey ready despite delays in timing due to Pandemic pressures. Following a period of questions and answers, S. Fraser thanked S. Poletti for her thorough presentation before departing the meeting at 1720 hours.
