Collaboration

Regional Geriatric Initiatives

For the past 18 months, St. Joseph's Care Group (SJCG) has partnered with the Centre for Education and Research on Aging and Health (CERAH) at Lakehead University and the Regional Geriatric Programs of Ontario in a \$1.7M initiative. In this collaboration, Tanya Shute, Social Worker, represented SJCG and the NW Region along with 9 other Regional Geriatric representatives to provide geriatric workshops in seven Ontario cities.

Tanya also played a significant role in the organizing of the Geriatric Interprofessional Practice and Interorganizational Collaboration Project (GiiC) conference held on January 13th & 14th, 2009. Dr. Trevor Bon, Geriatrician was one of the guest speakers, with a focus on "Geriatrics and Frailty".

LHIN e-Health

Beginning March 2, 2009, Brian Ktytor will be joining the NW LHIN as the Chief Information Officer and eHealth Lead. Thank you to Bruce Sutton, who for many months now, professionally and competently assumed this responsibility, in addition to his "real job" of SJCG/TBRHSC Chief Information Officer.

The LHIN has established an eHealth advisory team with membership from hospitals, CCAC, K-Net, a family health team physician, a Nurse Practitioner and others. This team will advise the LHIN leadership and the Board on NW-specific eHealth issues.

As one of the many ALC strategies, the LHIN is planning to install a software application that facilitates the process of matching available beds to patients on waiting lists and improves the efficiency of the transfer of patient information between facilities. Such a product showed great results in the Calgary region and that same product has been installed in the Toronto Central LHIN. TBRHSC has agreed to be paymaster for this project and it is hoped to have purchased the application before the fiscal year end. The intent is to expand the use of the system throughout the NWLHIN in the future.

Sudbury Visitors - St. Joseph's Health Centre

St. Joseph's Hospital Complex Care Team hosted a site visit from St. Joseph's Health Centre in Sudbury. With a new Complex Care Facility opening in Sudbury, our guests were keen to see how inpatient complex continuing care has been advanced in Thunder Bay, and to explore the possibilities of outpatient services.

Senior-Friendly Workshop

St. Joseph's Care Group collaborated with the Centre for Education and Research on Aging and Health (CERAH) to host a Senior-Friendly Workshop at the Victoria Inn. Honorary Director

CERAH Presentation

Dr. Mary Lou Kelly, of CERAH, presented 'Palliative Care in Long-Term Care' to staff at Bethammi Nursing Home. The presentation was based on participatory research conducted at Bethammi in 2008.

Capital Project Updates

Sister Margaret Smith Centre (SMSC)

Progress continues on construction of our new SMSC, with the work continuing on schedule. Work continues on the interior, as well as exterior finishing work. The SMSC Transfer Committee met in January to further develop the plans associated with the move from the present to new facility.

Mental Health Rehabilitation Program (MHRP)

The MHRP Steering Committee is reviewing the draft scope of work for the 'Head Start' project associated with the MHRP project to ensure minimal disruption to the Hospital site operation during the construction phase.

A request for proposal will go out for consultants to conduct the Master Programming/Master Planning exercise as required by the MOHLTC. This will ensure the best integration of the MHRP with the Hospital and will also allow us to plan for future development at other SJCG sites.

Centre of Excellence for Integrated Seniors Services (CEISS)

The project design team has been working on options and alternatives to reduce the overall budget for the CEISS project, at the request of the Minister of Health, and taking into account the current state of the economy. These options will be presented for the Board's review and consideration.

Honeywell Energy Retrofit Project

Installation work on the new boilers in the Hospital penthouse and associated piping to the existing boiler room continues. Installation of new lighting fixtures at the Hospital continues. The project is progressing on schedule at the hospital site with minimal disruption to clients and staff.
